Recognized for outstanding contributions to humanity by utilizing aviation



The event took place on Wednesday, October 3, at the San Diego Air & Space Museum's Pavilion of Flight.

Their individual contributions are prime examples of endurance and the adventurous exploring spirit in the pursuit of knowledge and scientific advancement to benefit the world.

About Angel Flight NE

Since 1996, Angel Flight Northeast (AFNE) has helped coordinate air transportation for patients and their families to access life-saving medical care outside of their local area.

The organization is comprised of over 400 active volunteer pilots who combine their love of flying with the spirit of grassroots volunteerism by flying patients and their families to the critical health care they need. Air transportation is provided in private aircraft by volunteer pilots as well as through partnership with commercial aviation partners so that children and adults may access lifesaving medical care free of charge. Earth Angels generously donate their time and vehicles to transport patients to and from the airport / medical facilities.

AFNE is also a vital mode of transportation for organs, blood and for patients awaiting organ transplants. The organization also make compassion flights and provide air care wherever there is a compelling human need.

About the Air Charity Network

Air Charity Network is a charitable organization of six independent autonomous organizations that provides access for people in need who are seeking free air transportation to specialized health care facilities or distant destinations due to family, community, or national crisis. Air Charity Network thru its members serves all 50 states and its volunteer pilots utilize their own aircraft, fuel and time to provide free air transportation to medical facilities for citizens who are financially distressed or otherwise unable to travel on public transportation. Air Charity Network member organizations also coordinate flights to fly organ transplant candidates, people involved in clinical trials, chemotherapy or other repetitive treatment, victims of abuse seeking relocation, families receiving help from national healthcare providers. Combined, the Air Charity Network is the Nation's largest unified Volunteer Pilot organization comprised of thousands of pilots who annually fly tens of thousands of passengers across the US providing 90% off all charitable medical air transportation flights in the United States.
